Introduction and Context to Building Schools for the Future (BSF)

BSF is the largest capital investment programme for 50 years that will see every single state secondary school rebuilt or renewed over the next 15 – 20 years, helping improve the life chances of 3.3 million young people.

BSF is not just about bricks and mortar: it is about transforming the face of education for generations to come, providing learning environments, in which every young person can unlock their talents and achieve their very best, no matter what their background and contributing to wider community regeneration and cohesion.

Through BSF, we have a responsibility to ensure that we are rebuilding the right schools, with the right facilities, in the right places at the right time. For the first time, local authorities are able to take a more strategic approach to investment

As well as raising aspirations and attainment in young people, BSF is also about providing inspiring environments in which teachers feel valued and stretch themselves. It is also about positioning schools as hubs in their communities, energising and revitalising local areas.

The workshop is free for all ISPAL members delivered in partnership between ISPAL and Partnership for Schools and will focus on the role of the Local Authority Leisure Departments in putting sport and activity at the heart of BSF.



Seminars to support the framework for delivering sport and PE provision

The BSF 'PE and Sport' work streams are driven by the PE and Sport Stakeholder Group. These group are designed to support and facilitate engagement from across the sector linking into the programme through the core BSF team in the Authority. However, their value is not so much the setting up, but the impact they have.

It is therefore vital that the representatives truly engage with their respective networks to ensure that the considerable information, knowledge and experience available is used to develop thinking and visioning to achieve 'transformation', from pre-engagement through to final completion of the programmes; and that this is shared with, fed into, and developed by the core BSF LA team.
